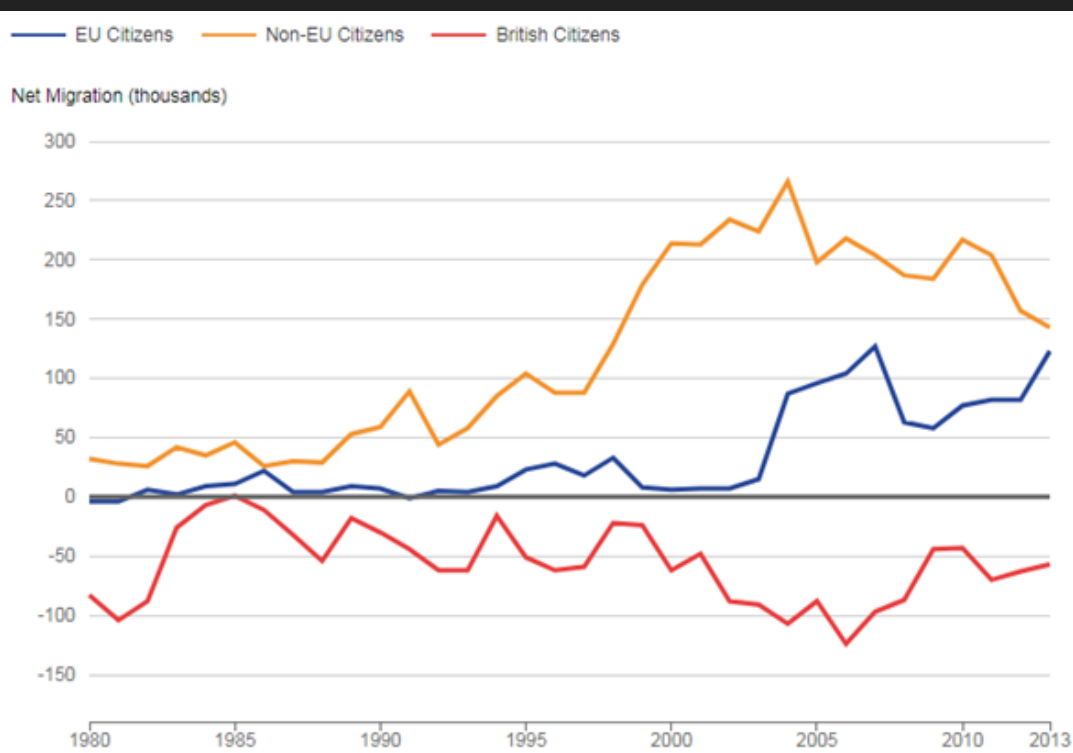


# UK migration policy before and after Brexit

THE LABOR GOVERNMENT OF T. BLAIR (1997-2007) SUPPORTED IMMIGRATION

OBTAINING A WORK PERMIT AND PROCESSING ASYLUM APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE EASIER



THE NUMBER OF MIGRANTS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM INCREASED FROM 4.7 MILLION (8% OF THE POPULATION) TO 7.6 MILLION (12%)

DURING THE PREMIERSHIP OF D. CAMERON (2010–2016), IMMIGRATION LEGISLATION WAS TIGHTENED



FROM 2010 TO 2015, THE NUMBER OF IMMIGRANTS FROM NON-EU COUNTRIES DECREASED BY 13%.

IN 2015, WHEN THE EUROPEAN MIGRATION CRISIS TOOK PLACE CAMERON ANNOUNCED THAT THE UK WILL BE ABLE TO BIND NO MORE THAN 20 THOUSAND SYRIAN ARMED FORCES

IN 2015 TOTAL IMMIGRATION TO THE UK AMOUNTED TO 617 THOUSAND PEOPLE

ACCORDING TO A POLL CONDUCTED BY YOUNG IN 2015, ONLY 10% OF RESPONDENTS SAID THAT MIGRANTS HAVE BENEFITED THE UNITED KINGDOM, 71% BELIEVED OTHERWISE.

FOLLOWING THE JUNE 2016 REFERENDUM, THE MAJORITY OF UK CITIZENS VOTED TO LEAVE THE EU (51,9%).



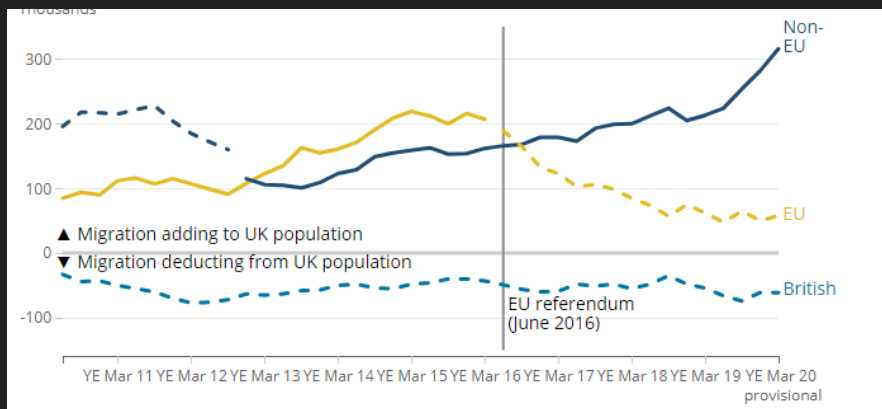
D. CAMERON'S GOVERNMENT INTRODUCED IMMIGRATION LAW, WHICH INTRODUCES CRIMINAL LIABILITY FOR ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS, AND THEIR EMPLOYERS IN THE FORM OF IMPRISONMENT

EU PROFESSIONALS LEAVING THE UK REPLACED BY LOW-SKILLED WORKERS FROM THIRD WORLD COUNTRIES

T. MAY'S CONSERVATIVE GOVERNMENT CONTINUED ITS LINE OF TOUGHENING MIGRATION POLICY IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

IN APRIL 2017, LEGISLATION WAS AMENDED REQUIRING ANY EMPLOYER TO PAY AN ADDITIONAL TAX ON EVERY IMMIGRANT WHO IS NOT AN EU CITIZEN

FROM JUNE 2016 TO JUNE 2019, THE LEVEL OF NET IMMIGRATION GRADUALLY DECREASED
